This is a sanctioned, non-qualifying competition sanctioned by the USFS in accordance with the rules of the USFS as set forth in the 2011-2012 USFS Rulebook. It is anticipated that events will begin on Friday morning. Practice ice will begin on Thursday late afternoon on March 22, 2012.

**LOCATION OF ALL EVENTS:** Wilson Park Recreation Center, 4001 South 20th Street, Milwaukee, Wisconsin. Rink size is 85' X 200' and snack bar is available.

### EVENTS

This competition will include the following ladies' and men's events:

**Free Skate:** No Test Through Senior, Adult

**Short Program:** Intermediate through Senior

**Championship Events:** Juvenile through Senior

**Compulsory Moves:** Limited Beginner through Juvenile /  
Open Juvenile

**Free Skate, Test Track:** Limited Beginner through Senior

**Spins:** No Test/ Beginner through Senior

**Jumps:** Pre-Juvenile through Senior

**Artistic:** No Test/Beginner through Intermediate

**Dance:** Pre-Juvenile through Senior

### ELIGIBILITY

Skaters must be eligible persons registered as members of the USFSA and may compete at their test level as of Feb. 10, 2012 for each event or one level higher. Championship events, Free Skate, Short Program, Compulsory Moves, Spins and Jumps must be skated at the same level. Skaters are allowed to enter both the Championship and separate Short Program and Free Skating events. Ages are as of Feb. 10, 2012.

A minimum of two entries are required for all events. Beginner through Pre-Juvenile events will be divided into groups of approximately 8 competitors according to age. International Judging System (IJS) will be used for Juvenile, Intermediate, Novice, Junior and Senior Combined and Single Open Free skating Events.

**A complete application consists of APPLICATION FORM, SIGNATURE PAGE, a SELF-ADDRESS ENVELOPE AND FEES. All PLANNED PROGRAM CONTENT FORMS MUST BE REGISTERED ON USFS WEB SITE (FOR IJS EVENTS).**

Entry Fees are to be made payable to W.I.M. Competition and must accompany each application. In the event of limitations on the size of events, entries with earlier postmarks will receive priority. No refunds (including medical) will be made after the closing date of Feb. 10, 2012, unless event is canceled for lack of participation.

**Entries must be postmarked by Feb. 10, 2012. No metered mail will be accepted.**

### GROUPS

A large number of entries in some events will be divided into groups as follows: Beginner through Juvenile and Open Juvenile will be grouped by birth date. Intermediate through Senior events and Championship events will be grouped by random draw. For limited Beginner, Pre-Juvenile, Open Pre-Juvenile Compulsory Moves events and all Spin and Jump events, groups with insufficient entries at a particular level may be combined and male and female entrants judged together.

### JUDGING SYSTEM

The 2012 W.I.M. Competition will use the ISU judging system for Juvenile - Senior (unrestricted) Singles events. All other events, including Open Juvenile Singles and Juvenile-Senior Test Track events, will use the majority 6.0 system. The International Judging System (IJS) will be used on all Free Skate, Championship and Short Program events Juvenile through Senior levels only. **PLEASE READ ON PPC FORM REQUIREMENTS.**

## **IJS PLANNED PROGRAM CONTENT**

Those skaters participating in IJS judging system events need to submit a **Planned Program Content Form to be downloaded at [WWW.USFIGURESKATING.ORG](http://WWW.USFIGURESKATING.ORG) and filed on-line at the USFS on the Members Only site.**

## **EVENT CANCELLATIONS**

Any scheduled event may be canceled if fewer than two skaters are entered. Due to ice limitations, the Chief Referee reserves the right to limit entries based on earliest postmark or to eliminate events with suitable notification to the entrants and return entry fees for that event.

## **WITHDRAWALS, SCRATCHES, AND REFUNDS**

## **SCHEDULE OF EVENTS**

A stamped, self addressed envelope must be enclosed with application to enable entrants to be notified of their competition time by Saturday, March 17, 2012. Schedule will be posted on our website, [www.greatermilwaukeeefsc.org](http://www.greatermilwaukeeefsc.org) no later than Saturday, March 17, 2012.

## **PRACTICE ICE**

Practice ice will be sold at the Registration desk only. Availability will be dependent on scheduling of competition. No phone call scheduling for practice ice will be accepted. All sessions will be \$10.00 per one half hour and will be posted on our website, [www.greatermilwaukeeefsc.org](http://www.greatermilwaukeeefsc.org) approximately two weeks before the competition.

## **REGISTRATION DESK**

The Registration Desk in the lobby of the Wilson Park Recreation Center will be open throughout the competition weekend, beginning Thursday March 22, 2012 after 4:00 p.m. Each skater must check in upon arrival, at least 45 minutes before each event. If you skate multiple days, e.g., Friday and Saturday, please check in with the registration desk both days to confirm your event.

## **BULLETINS AND NOTICES**

Prior to the event, updated schedules and information will be available at [www.greatermilwaukeeefsc.org](http://www.greatermilwaukeeefsc.org). During the competition, a bulletin board displaying official information will be located in the lobby of Wilson Park Recreation Center where any important information regarding this competition will be posted. Posting on this board will be considered sufficient notice to all competitors.

## **AWARDS**

Awards will be presented to the top four places in each event. Awards will also be given to the top four skaters for the combined short and long programs in initial rounds of Championship events and the top four Championship final round places. All awards will be presented off-ice immediately following the completion of the event and the posting of the results.

## **MUSIC**

Music will be played from CD ONLY. The CD must contain only the selection for the event. Music must be turned in at the time of registration. Music must be clearly marked with the skater's name, event and group. Entrants are responsible for timing of music. Skaters must have back-up music at rink side during their event. CD's should be picked up following your event. Greater Milwaukee Figure Skating Club cannot accept responsibility for unclaimed music. Music will not be returned by mail if left at the competition.

## **VIDEO AND PHOTOGRAPHY SERVICES**

Videotaping services will be available at the competition. All information will be available at Registration. If you will be videotaping, please be considerate of others and do so from the top of the stands. No flash photography is permitted in the ice arena. The use of ice arena power sources is prohibited.

## Illinois Grand Prix of Figure Skating

During the 2011-2012 competition season, the Skating Council of Illinois is again offering skaters the opportunity to earn an invitation to the Illinois Grand Prix of Figure Skating by competing in Free Skate events at our competitions. The top twelve (12) skaters in each category will be invited to compete, at no cost, at the Illinois Grand Prix of Figure Skating, which will be held at the Northbrook Sports Center on September 23, 2012. Skaters must compete in a minimum of four (4) of the competitions listed below. Special recognition will be given to skaters who compete in all seven (7) events. Grand Prix information and standings will be posted on the Skating Council of Illinois website at <http://www.skatingcouncilofillinois.org>.

### Awards:

The Free Skate events of each competition will be eligible for accumulating points. The system for scoring points for the final award will be as follows:

Competitors who perform their free skate program more than once at a competition (i.e., qualifying and final rounds) will receive the highest points earned for any one performance. If an event has less than 6 skaters, the points will be awarded as if there were 6 skaters in the group. If there is only one skater in the group, they will be awarded 5 points. At the end of the Series, the top 12 competitors in each category, who have competed in at least 4 competitions, will be invited to the Illinois Grand Prix of Figure Skating. Ties will not be broken.

## Illinois Grand Prix of Figure Skating

### Frequently Asked Questions

**How do I enter the Championships?** Participation in the Illinois Grand Prix of Figure Skating is by invitation only. To be invited to compete, you must have competed in at least 4 of the Grand Prix competitions and must be one of the top 12 skaters in each category. Eligible competitors will be sent invitations immediately following the Greater Chicagoland Fall Invitational.

**What does it cost to enter?** There is no entry fee for the Illinois Grand Prix of Figure Skating. The Skating Council of Illinois and our participating clubs are supporting this event, Practice Ice will be available for purchase. There will also be vendors, including video and still photography.

**Who will keep my points and how will I know how many points I have?** Ed Mann, a National Accountant, will tabulate points as the season progresses. Standings will be posted on the Skating Council of Illinois web site at [www.skatingcouncilofillinois.org](http://www.skatingcouncilofillinois.org). It is the responsibility of each competitor to verify the accuracy of the points posted on the website. Discrepancies should be brought to the attention of Ed Mann.

**What happens to my points if I change categories during the season?** Your points stay with you if you skate at more than one level. Eligibility to skate at the Illinois Grand Prix of Figure Skating will be determined by test level.

## WELL-BALANCED FREE SKATE EVENTS

Skaters may compete at their test level as of Feb. 10, 2012 or one level higher. Skaters may enter either the Test Track or Open Free Skate events but not both. Skaters must compete at the same level for all events. The IJS judging system is used for Juvenile-Senior events, except Open Juvenile. **Refer to USFS Rule Book for Program Content under Well-Balanced Program under numbers 4000 - 4600.** A diamond indicates Grand Prix event.

## TEST TRACK FREE SKATE EVENTS

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## CHAMPIONSHIP FREE SKATING EVENTS

Championship Open Free Skating events, using the IJS, will be offered at the Juvenile, Intermediate, Novice, Junior and Senior level. The Championship Event is a combined event consisting of the Short and Long Program. Combined Events will not be grouped by age in the initial rounds and the groups may be larger. A final round will be offered only in the events that will have two groups or more. When there is only one group in the Juvenile Event, the number of skaters that will advance to a final round will be determined by the Chief Referee. **A PLANNED PROGRAM CONTENT FORM MUST BE REGISTERED ON THE USFS WEBSITE.**

## COMPULSORY MOVES EVENTS

Eligibility is the same as for Free Skating events. Skaters may enter at their test level or one level higher but all events must be skated at the same level. Compulsory Moves are skated without music. The specified moves may be in any order but must be skated exactly. An Axel is a single jump. Connecting steps must be distinguishable from a footwork sequence.

Limited Beginner through Pre-Juvenile and Open Pre-Juvenile Compulsory Moves events with insufficient entries at a particular level may be combined, male and female entrants judged together.

## SPIN EVENTS

Eligibility is the same as for Free Skating events. Skaters may enter at their test level or one level higher but all events must be skated at the same level. All levels will be skated on half ice surface. Spins must be skated exactly as stated, but may be skated in any order. Connecting moves and short sequences of footwork may be used between spins and will not be judged. No music. Limited Beginner through Pre-Juvenile and Open Pre-Juvenile Compulsory Moves events with insufficient entries at a particular level may be combined, male and female entrants judged together.

Spins shall be skated in a SIMPLE PROGRAM with no extra or repeated elements. Boys and Girls may be combined.
